

### Preface *may102014*

This book contains only the personal quotes of Messias, throughout the entire New Testament: including the four "synopsis gospels" of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John; plus the Book of Acts; and the Book of Revelation. This way, one can better determine our Savior's will, character, and personality.

This version is using the *original* text of the *Textus Receptus* based King James Version of 1611, with the exception of a necessary restoration of the original Sacred Names and Titles of Elohim being properly returned to their correct places in holy Writ, replacing erroneously inserted and incorrect traditional names and titles of the Creator and his Son Yahshua (which name has not here been rendered "Joshua" after the dated usage of the name from 1611, which should have been used in those days had they forsaken tradition for accuracy; for the same reason, the editor has rendered "Messiah" as the more dated "Messias"); including the exception of "El/Elohim" (mighty one/s) replacing the title "God" or "gods."

There are also a few additional changes: in punctuation, in order to make the text more legible; and with scant notes after perplexing antiquated words (in parenthesis); plus, text is occassionally rendered 'gender friendly' with "women" added in italics.-ed.

ALSO, last but not least: all inserts not in the original Greek texts have been removed from this volume, with explanations in another booklet.

Verily I say unto you, They have their reward. 6:5; But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to thy Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly. 6:6; But when ye pray, use not vain repetitions, as the heathen do: for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking.6:7; Be not ye therefore like unto them: for your Father knoweth what things ye have need of, before ye ask him. 6:8;

After this manner therefore pray ye:

Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. 6:9;

Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven. 6:10;

Give us this day our daily bread. 6:11;

And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. 6:12;

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: For thine is the Kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen. 6:13;

For if ye forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you: 6:14; But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses. 6:15;

Moreover when ye fast, be not, as the hypocrites, of a sad countenance: for they disfigure their faces, that they may appear unto men to fast. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward. 6:16; But thou, when thou fastest, anoint thine head, and wash thy face; 6:17; That thou appear not unto men to fast, but unto thy Father which is in secret: and thy Father, which seeth in secret, shall reward thee openly.6:18;

Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: 6:19; But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: 6:20; For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also. 6:21;

The light of the body is the eye: if therefore thine eye be single, thy whole body shall be full of light. 6:22; But if thine eye be evil, thy whole body shall be full of darkness. Is not the life more than meat, and the body than raiment? 6:25; Behold the fowls of the air: for they sow not, neither do they reap, nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are ye not much better than they? 6:26; Which of you by taking thought can add one cubit unto his stature? 6:27; And why take ye thought for raiment? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they toil not, neither do they spin: 6:28; And yet I say unto you, That even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. 6:29; Wherefore, if El so clothe the grass of the field, which to day is, and to morrow is cast into the oven, shall he not much more clothe you, O ye of little faith? 6:30; Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed? 6:31; For after all these things do the Gentiles seek: for your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things. 6:32; But seek ye first the Kingdom of El, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you. 6:33; Take therefore no thought for the morrow: for the morrow shall take thought for the things of itself. Sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof. 6:34;

Judge not, that ye be not judged. For with what judgment ye judge, ye shall be judged: and with what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you again. 7:2; And why beholdest thou the mote

that is in thy brother's eye, but considerest not the beam that is in thine own eye? 7:3; Or how wilt thou say to thy brother, Let me pull out the mote out of thine eye; and, behold, a beam is in thine own eye? 7:4; Thou hypocrite, first cast out the beam out of thine own eye; and then shalt thou see clearly to cast out the mote out of thy brother's eye. 7:5;

Give not that which is holy unto the dogs, neither cast ye your pearls before swine, lest they trample them under their feet, and turn again and rend you. 7:6;

Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you: 7:8; For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened. 7:7; Or what man is there of you, whom if his son ask bread, will he give him a stone? 7:9; Or if he ask a fish, will he give him a serpent? 7:10; If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your Father which is in heaven give good things to them that ask him? 7:11; Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the Law and the Prophets. 7:12;

Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat: 7:13; Because strait is the gate and narrow is the way which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it. 7:14;

If they have called the master of the house Beelzebub, how much more shall they call them of his household? 10:25; Fear them not therefore: for there is nothing covered, that shall not be revealed; and hid, that shall not be known. 10:26; What I tell you in darkness, that speak ye in light: and what ye hear in the ear, that preach ye upon the housetops. 10:27; And fear not them which kill the body, but are not able to kill the soul: but rather fear him which is able to destroy both soul and body in hell (gehenna-ed.). 10:28;

Are not two sparrows sold for a farthing? and one of them shall not fall on the ground without your Father. 10:29; But the very hairs of your head are all numbered. 10:30; Fear ye not therefore, ye are of more value than many sparrows. 10:31; Whosoever therefore shall confess me before men, him will I confess also before my Father which is in heaven. 10:32; But whosoever shall deny me before men, him will I also deny before my Father which is in heaven. 10:33;

Think not that I am come to send peace on earth: I came not to send peace, but a sword. 10:34; For I am come to set a man at variance against his father, and the daughter against her mother, and the daughter in law against her mother in law. 10:35; And a man's foes shall be they of his own household. 10:36; He that loveth father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and he that loveth son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me. 10:37; And he that taketh not his cross, and followeth after me, is

not worthy of me. 10:38; He that findeth his life shall lose it: and he that loseth his life for my sake shall find it. 10:39;

But wisdom is justified of her children. 11:19;

But if I cast out devils by the Spirit of El, then the Kingdom of El is come unto you! 12:28; Or else how can one enter into a strong man's house and spoil his goods, except he first bind the strong man? and then he will spoil his house. 12:29;

He that is not with me is against me; and he that gathereth not with me scattereth abroad. 12:30; Wherefore I say unto you, All manner of sin and blasphemy shall be forgiven unto men: but the blasphemy against the holy Ghost shall not be forgiven unto men. 12:31:

And whosoever speaketh a word against the Son of man, it shall be forgiven him: but whosoever speaketh against the holy Ghost, it shall not be forgiven him, neither in this world, neither in the world to come. 12:32;

Either make the tree good, and his fruit good; or else make the tree corrupt, and his fruit corrupt: for the tree is known by his fruit. 12:33;

O' generation of vipers, how can ye, being evil, speak good things? for out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh. 12:34; A good man out of the good treasure of the heart bringeth forth good things: and an evil man out of the evil treasure bringeth forth evil things. 12:35; But I say unto you, That every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the day of Judgment. 12:36; For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned. 12:37;

An evil and adulterous generation seeketh after a sign; and there shall no sign be given to it, but the sign of the prophet Jonas: 12:39; For as Jonas was three days and three nights in the whale's belly; so shall the Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth. 12:40; The men of Nineveh shall rise in Judgment with this generation, and shall condemn it: because they repented at the preaching of Jonas; and, behold, a greater than Jonas is here! 12:41; The queen of the south shall rise up in the Judgment with this generation, and shall condemn it: for she came from the uttermost parts of the earth to hear the wisdom of Solomon; and, behold, a greater than Solomon is here! 12:42;

When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through dry places, seeking rest, and findeth none. 12:43; Then he

saith, "I will return into my house from whence I came out"; and when he is come, he findeth it empty, swept, and garnished. 12:44; Then goeth he, and taketh with himself seven other spirits more wicked than himself, and they enter in and dwell there: and the last state of that man is worse than the first. Even so shall it be also unto this wicked generation. 12:45;

Who is my mother? and who are my brethren? 12:49; Behold my mother and my brethren! 12:48;

...For whosoever shall do the will of my Father which is in heaven, the same is my brother, and sister, and mother. 12:50;

Behold, a sower went forth to sow;

And when he sowed, some seeds fell by the way side, and the fowls came and devoured them up: 13:4;

Some fell upon stony places, where they had not much earth: and forthwith they sprung up, because they had no deepness of earth: 13:5; And when the sun was up, they were scorched; and because they had no root, they withered away. 13:6;

And some fell among thorns; and the thorns sprung up, and choked them:13:7;

But other fell into good ground, and brought forth fruit, some an hundredfold, some sixtyfold, some thirtyfold. 13:8;

Who hath ears to hear, let him hear! 13:9;

Hear ye therefore the parable of the sower: 13:18;

When any one heareth the word of the kingdom, and understandeth it not, then cometh the wicked one, and catcheth away that which was sown in his heart. This is he which received seed by the way side. 13:19;

But he that received the seed into stony places, the same is he that heareth the word, and anon with joy receiveth it; 13:20; Yet hath he not root in himself, but dureth for a while: for when tribulation or persecution ariseth because of the word, by and by he is offended. 13:21;

He also that received seed among the thorns is he that heareth the word; and the care of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, choke the word, and he becometh unfruitful. 13:22;

But he that received seed into the good ground is he that heareth the word, and understandeth it; which also beareth fruit, and bringeth forth, some an hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. 13:23;

The Kingdom of Heaven is likened unto a man which sowed good seed in his field: 13:24; But while men slept, his enemy came and sowed tares among the wheat, and went his way. 13:25; But

when the blade was sprung up, and brought forth fruit, then appeared the tares also. 13:26; So the servants of the householder came and said unto him, "Sir, didst not thou sow good seed in thy field? from whence then hath it tares?" 13:27; He said unto them, "An enemy hath done this." The servants said to him, "Wilt thou then that we go and gather them up?" 13:28; But he said, "Nay; lest while ye gather up the tares, ye root up also the wheat with them. 13:29; "Let both grow together until the harvest: and in the time of harvest I will say to the reapers, 'Gather ye together first the tares, and bind them in bundles to burn them: but gather the wheat into my barn." 13:30;

The Kingdom of Heaven is like to a grain of mustard seed, which a man took, and sowed in his field: 13:31; Which indeed is the least of all seeds: but when it is grown, it is the greatest among herbs, and becometh a tree, so that the birds of the air come and lodge in the branches thereof. 13:32;

The Kingdom of Heaven is like unto leaven, which a woman took, and hid in three measures of meal, till the whole was leavened. 13:33;

. . .

He that soweth the good seed is the Son of man; 13:37; The field is the world; the good seed are the children of the kingdom; but the tares are the children of the wicked one; 13:38;

The enemy that sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; and the reapers are the angels. 13:39;

As therefore the tares are gathered and burned in the fire; so shall it be in the end of this world. 13:40; The Son of man shall send forth his angels, and they shall gather out of his Kingdom all things that offend, and them which do iniquity; 13:41; And shall cast them into a furnace of fire: there shall be wailing and gnashing of teeth. 13:42;

Then shall the righteous shine forth as the sun in the Kingdom of their Father.

Who hath ears to hear, let him hear! 13:43;

Again, the Kingdom of Heaven is like unto treasure hid in a field; the which when a man hath found, he hideth, and for joy thereof goeth and selleth all that he hath, and buyeth that field. 13:44;

Again, the Kingdom of Heaven is like unto a merchant man, seeking goodly pearls: 13:45; Who, when he had found one pearl of great price, went and sold all that he had, and bought it. 13:46;

Again, the Kingdom of Heaven is like unto a net, that was cast into the sea, and gathered of every kind: 13:47; Which, when it was full, they drew to shore, and sat down, and gathered the good into vessels, but cast the bad away. 13:48;

Hear, and understand: 15:10; Not that which goeth into the mouth defileth a man; but that which cometh out of the mouth, this defileth a man. 15:11;

#### 18:3;

Verily I say unto you, Except ye be converted, and become as little children, ye shall not enter into the Kingdom of Heaven. Whosoever therefore shall humble himself as this little child, the same is greatest in the Kingdom of Heaven. 18:4; And whoso shall receive one such little child in my name receiveth me. 18:5; But whoso shall offend one of these little ones which believe in me, it were better for him that a millstone were hanged about his neck, and that he were drowned in the depth of the sea. 18:6;

Take heed that ye despise not one of these little ones; for I say unto you, That in heaven their angels do always behold the face of my Father which is in heaven. 18:10; For the Son of man is come to save that which was lost. 18:11; How think ye? if a man have an hundred sheep, and one of them be gone astray, doth he not leave the ninety and nine, and goeth into the mountains, and seeketh that which is gone astray? 18:12; And if so be that he find it, verily I say unto you, he rejoiceth more of that sheep, than of the ninety

and nine which went not astray. 18:13; Even so it is not the will of your Father which is in heaven, that one of these little ones should perish. 18:14;

Moreover if thy brother shall trespass against thee, go and tell him his fault between thee and him alone: if he shall hear thee, thou hast gained thy brother. 18:15; But if he will not hear thee, then take with thee one or two more, that in the mouth of two or three witnesses every word may be established. 18:16; And if he shall neglect to hear them, tell it unto the church: but if he neglect to hear the church, let him be unto thee as an heathen man and a publican. 18:17;

Verily I say unto you, Whatsoever ye shall bind on earth shall be bound in heaven: and whatsoever ye shall loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven. 18:18;

Again I say unto you, That if two of you shall agree on earth as touching any thing that they shall ask, it shall be done for them of my Father which is in heaven. 18:19; For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there I am in the midst of them. 18:20;

I say not unto thee, Until seven times: but, Until seventy times seven! (to forgive-ed.) 18:22;

Therefore is the Kingdom of Heaven likened unto a certain king, which would take account of his servants. 18:23; And when he had begun to reckon, one was brought unto him, which owed him ten thousand talents. 18:24; But forasmuch as he had not to pay, his lord commanded him to be sold, and his wife, and children, and all that he had, and payment to be made. 18:25; The servant therefore fell down and worshipped him (bowed unto himed.), saying, "Lord, have patience with me, and I will pay thee all!" 18:26;

Then the lord of that servant was moved with compassion, and loosed him, and forgave him the debt. 18:27; But the same servant went out, and found one of his fellowservants, which owed him an

hundred pence: and he laid hands on him, and took him by the throat, saying, "Pay me that thou owest!" 18:28; And his fellowservant fell down at his feet, and besought him, saying, "Have patience with me, and I will pay thee all!" 18:29; And he would not: but went and cast him into prison, till he should pay the debt. 18:30:

So when his fellowservants saw what was done, they were very sorry, and came and told unto their lord all that was done. 18:31; Then his lord, after that he had called him, said unto him, "O' thou wicked servant, I forgave thee all that debt, because thou desiredst me: 18:32; "Shouldest not thou also have had compassion on thy fellowservant, even as I had pity on thee?" 18:33; And his lord was wroth, and delivered him to the tormentors, till he should pay all that was due unto him. 18:34; So likewise shall my heavenly Father do also unto you, if ye from your hearts forgive not every one his brother their trespasses. 18:35;

#### 19:4;

Have ye not read, "that he which made them at the beginning made them male and female," And said, "For this cause shall a man leave father and mother, and shall cleave to his wife: and they twain shall be one flesh?" 19:5; Wherefore they are no more twain, but one flesh. If thou wilt be perfect, go and sell that thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, follow me! 19:21;

Verily I say unto you, That a rich man shall hardly enter into the Kingdom of Heaven. 19:23; And again I say unto you, It is easier for a rope (\*camel) to go through the eye of a needle, than for a rich man to enter into the kingdom of El. (\*"gamia" means both rope and camel: Lamsa's Aramaic Peshitta, pg.1041-ed.) 19:24;

... With men this is impossible; but with El, all things are possible. 19:26:

Verily I say unto you, That ye which have followed me, in the regeneration when the Son of man shall sit in the throne of his glory, ye also shall sit upon twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. 19:28; And every one that hath forsaken houses, or brethren, or sisters, or father, or mother, or wife, or children, or

lands, for my name's sake, shall receive an hundredfold, and shall inherit everlasting Life. 19:29;

But many that are first shall be last; and the last shall be first. 19:30:

#### 20:1;

For the Kingdom of Heaven is like unto a man that is an householder, which went out early in the morning to hire labourers into his vineyard. And when he had agreed with the labourers for a penny a day, he sent them into his vineyard. 20:2; And he went out about the third hour, and saw others standing idle in the marketplace,20:3; And said unto them; "Go ye also into the vineyard, and whatsoever is right I will give you." And they went their way. 20:4; Again he went out about the sixth and ninth hour, and did likewise. 20:5;

And about the eleventh hour he went out, and found others standing idle, and saith unto them, "Why stand ye here all the day idle?" 20:6; They say unto him, "Because no man hath hired us." He saith unto them, "Go ye also into the vineyard; and whatsoever is right, that shall ye receive." 20:7;

So when even was come, the lord of the vineyard saith unto his steward, "Call the labourers, and give them their hire, beginning from the last unto the first." 20:8; And when they came that were hired about the eleventh hour, they received every man a penny. 20:9; But when the first came, they supposed that they should have received more; and they likewise received every man a penny. 20:10; And when they had received it, they murmured against the goodman of the house, 20:11; Saying, "These last have wrought but one hour, and thou hast made them equal unto us, which have borne the burden and heat of the day." 20:12;

But he answered one of them, and said, "Friend, I do thee no wrong: didst not thou agree with me for a penny? 20:13; "Take that

which thine is, and go thy way: I will give unto this last, even as unto thee. 20:14; Is it not lawful for me to do what I will with mine own? Is thine eye evil, because I am good?" 20:15;

So the last shall be first, and the first last: for many be called, but few chosen. 20:16:

Behold, we go up to Jerusalem; and the Son of man shall be betrayed unto the chief priests and unto the scribes, and they shall condemn him to death, 20:18; And shall deliver him to the Gentiles to mock, and to scourge, and to crucify him: and the third day he shall rise again. 20:19;

I also will ask you one thing, which if ye tell me, I in like wise will tell you by what authority I do these things. 21:23;

The baptism of John, whence was it? from heaven, or of men? 21:24;

Neither tell I you by what authority I do these things. 21:27;

But what think ye? A certain man had two sons; and he came to the first, and said, Son, go work to day in my vineyard. 21:28;

Hear another parable: There was a certain householder, which planted a vineyard, and hedged it round about, and digged a winepress in it and built a tower, and let it out to husbandmen, and went into a far country: 21:33; And when the time of the fruit drew near, he sent his servants to the husbandmen, that they might receive the fruits of it. 21:34; And the husbandmen took his servants, and beat one, and killed another, and stoned another. 21:35;

Again, he sent other servants more than the first: and they did unto them likewise. 21:36; But last of all he sent unto them his son, saying, "They will reverence my son." 21:37; But when the husbandmen saw the son, they said among themselves, "This is the heir; come, let us kill him, and let us seize on his inheritance." 21:38; And they caught him, and cast him out of the vineyard, and slew him. 21:39;

When the lord therefore of the vineyard cometh, what will he do unto those husbandmen? 21:40;

Yahshua saith unto them, Did ye never read in the scriptures, "The stone which the builders rejected, the same is become the

head of the corner: this is YAHWEH's doing, and it is marvellous in our eyes?" 21:42;

The Kingdom of Heaven is like unto a certain king, which made a marriage for his son, And sent forth his servants to call them that were bidden to the wedding: and they would not come. 22:3;

Ye do err, not knowing the scriptures, nor the power of El. 22:29; For in the Resurrection they neither marry, nor are given in marriage, but are as the angels of El in heaven. 22:30; But as touching the Resurrection of the dead, have ye not read that which was spoken unto you by El, saying, 22:31; "I am the El of Abraham, and the El of Isaac, and the El of Jacob?" El is not the El of the dead, but of the living. 22:32;

Thou shalt love Yahweh thy El with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. 22:37; This is the first great Commandment. 22:38; And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. 22:39; On these two Commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets. 22:40;

What think ye of Messias? Whose son is he? 22:42; How then doth David in spirit call him Lord, saying, 22:43; "Yahweh said unto my Lord, Sit thou on my right hand, till I make thine enemies thy footstool?" 22:44;

If David then call him Lord, how is he his son? 22:45;

The scribes and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat: All therefore whatsoever they bid you observe, that observe and do; but do not ye after their works: for they say, and do not. 23:3; For they bind heavy burdens and grievous to be borne, and lay them on men's shoulders; but they themselves will not move them with one of their fingers. 23:4; But all their works they do for to be seen of men: they make broad their phylacteries, and enlarge the borders of their garments, 23:5; And love the uppermost rooms at feasts, and the chief seats in the synagogues, 23:6; And greetings in the markets, and to be called of men, "Rabbi, Rabbi." 23:7;

Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye devour widows' houses, and for a pretence make long prayer; therefore ye shall receive the greater damnation. 23:14;

Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye compass sea and land to make one proselyte, and when he is made, ye make him twofold more the child of hell (gehenna- ed.) than yourselves. 23:15;

Woe unto you, ye blind guides, which say, "Whosoever shall swear by the Temple, it is nothing; but whosoever shall swear by the gold of the Temple, he is a debtor!" 23:16;

Ye fools and blind: for whether is greater, the gold, or the Temple that sanctifieth the gold? 23:17; And, "Whosoever shall

swear by the altar, it is nothing; but whosoever sweareth by the gift that is upon it, he is guilty!" 23:18; Ye fools and blind: for whether is greater, the gift, or the altar that sanctifieth the gift? 23:19; Whoso therefore shall swear by the altar, sweareth by it, and by all things thereon. 23:20; And whoso shall swear by the Temple, sweareth by it, and by him that dwelleth therein. 23:21; And he that shall swear by heaven, sweareth by the throne of El, and by him that sitteth thereon. 23:22;

Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye pay tithe of mint and anise and cummin, and have omitted the weightier matters of the law, Judgment, Mercy, and Faith: these ought ye to have done, and not to leave the other undone. 23:23; Ye blind guides, which strain at (out) a gnat, and swallow a camel! 23:24;

Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye make clean the outside of the cup and of the platter, but within they are full of extortion and excess. 23:25; Thou blind Pharisee, cleanse first that which is within the cup and platter, that the outside of them may be clean also. 23:26;

Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye are like unto whited sepulchres, which indeed appear beautiful outward, but are within full of dead men's bones, and of all uncleanness. 23:27; Even so ye also outwardly appear righteous unto men, but within ye are full of hypocrisy and iniquity. 23:28;

Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! because ye build the tombs of the prophets, and garnish the sepulchres of the righteous, 23:29; And say, "If we had been in the days of our fathers, we would not have been partakers with them in the blood of the prophets." 23:30; Wherefore ye be witnesses unto yourselves, that ye are the children of them which killed the prophets! 23:31; Fill ye up then the measure of your fathers! 23:32; Ye serpents, ye generation of vipers, how can ye escape the damnation of hell (Gehenna)? 23:33;

Wherefore, behold, I send unto you prophets, and wise men, and scribes: and some of them ye shall kill and crucify; and some of them shall ye scourge in your synagogues, and persecute them from city to city: 23:34; That upon you may come all the righteous blood shed upon the earth, from the blood of righteous Abel unto the blood of Zacharias, son of Barachias, whom ye slew between the Temple and the altar! 23:35; Verily I say unto you, All these things shall come upon this generation. 23:36;

But pray ye that your flight be not in the winter, neither on the Sabbath day: 24:20; For then shall be Great Tribulation, such as was not since the beginning of the world to this time, no, nor ever shall be! 24:21;

And except those days should be shortened, there should no flesh be Saved: but for the Elect's sake, those days shall be shortened. 24:22;

And these are they which are sown on good ground; such as hear the word, and receive it, and bring forth fruit, some thirtyfold, some sixty, and some an hundred. 4:20;

Are not five sparrows sold for two farthings, and not one of them is forgotten before El? 12:6; But even the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Fear not therefore, ye are of more value than many sparrows. 12:7;

Also I say unto you, Whosoever shall confess me before men, him shall the Son of man also confess before the angels of El: 12:8; But he that denieth me before men shall be denied before the angels of El. 12:9;

And whosoever shall speak a word against the Son of man, it shall be forgiven him: but unto him that blasphemeth against the holy Ghost, it shall not be forgiven. 12:10;

And when they bring you unto the synagogues, and unto magistrates, and powers, take ye no thought how or what thing ye shall answer, or what ye shall say: 12:11; For the holy Ghost shall teach you in the same hour what ye ought to say. 12:12;

are ye better than the fowls? 12;24; And which of you, taking thought, can add to his stature one cubit? 12:25; If ye then be not able to do that thing which is least, why take ye thought for the rest? 12:26:

Consider the lilies, how they grow: they toil not, they spin not; and yet I say unto you, that Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. 12:27; If then El so clothe the grass, which is to day in the field, and to morrow is cast into the oven; how much more will he clothe you, O' ye of little faith? 12:28; And seek not ye what ye shall eat, or what ye shall drink, neither be ye of doubtful mind. 12:29; For all these things do the nations of the world seek after: and your Father knoweth that ye have need of these things. 12:30; But rather seek ye the kingdom of El; and all these things shall be added unto you. 12:31;

Fear not, little flock; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the Kingdom. 12:32; Sell that ye have, and give alms; provide yourselves bags which wax not old, a treasure in the heavens that faileth not, where no thief approacheth, neither moth corrupteth. 12:33; For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also. 12:34;

Let your loins be girded about, and your lights burning; 12:35; And ye yourselves like unto men that wait for their lord, when he will return from the wedding; that when he cometh and knocketh, they may open unto him immediately. 12:36; Blessed are those servants, whom the lord when he cometh, shall find watching: verily I say unto you, that he shall gird himself, and make them to sit down to meat, and will come forth and serve them. 12:37; And if he shall come in the second watch, or come in the third watch, and find them so, blessed are those servants. 12:38;

But and if that servant say in his heart, "My lord delayeth his coming"; and shall begin to beat the menservants and maidens, and to eat and drink, and to be drunken; 12:45; The lord of that servant will come in a day when he looketh not for him, and at an hour when he is not aware, and will cut him in sunder, and will appoint him his portion with the unbelievers. 12:46; And that servant, which knew his lord's will, and prepared not himself, neither did according to his will, shall be beaten with many stripes. 12:47; But he that knew not, and did commit things worthy of stripes, shall be beaten with few stripes. For unto whomsoever much is given, of him shall be much required: and to whom men have committed much, of him they will ask the more. 12:48;

I am come to send fire on the earth; and what will I, if it be already kindled? 12:49;

But I have a baptism to be baptized with; and how am I straitened, till it be accomplished? 12:50;

Suppose ye that I am come to give peace on earth? I tell you, Nay!, but rather division: 12:51; For from henceforth there shall be five in one house divided, three against two, and two against three. 12:52; The father shall be divided against the son, and the son against the father; the mother against the daughter, and the daughter against the mother; the mother in law against her daughter in law, and the daughter in law against her mother in law. 12:53;

When ye see a cloud rise out of the west, straightway ye say, "There cometh a shower"; and so it is. 12:54; And when ye see the south wind blow, ye say, "There will be heat"; and it cometh to pass. 12:55; Ye hypocrites, ye can discern the face of the sky and of the earth; but how is it that ye do not discern this time? 12:56; Yea, and why even of yourselves judge ye not what is right? 12:57;

When thou goest with thine adversary to the magistrate, as thou art in the way, give diligence that thou mayest be delivered from him; lest he hale thee to the judge, and the judge deliver thee to the officer, and the officer cast thee into prison. 12:58; I tell thee, thou shalt not depart thence, till thou hast paid the very last mite. 12:59;

# 13:2;

Suppose ye that these Galilaeans were sinners above all the Galilaeans, because they suffered such things? I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish. 13:3; Or those eighteen, upon whom the tower in Siloam fell, and slew them, think ye that they were sinners above all men that dwelt in Jerusalem? 13:4; I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish. 13:5;

A certain man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came and sought fruit thereon, and found none. 13:6; Then said he unto the dresser of his vineyard, "Behold, these three years I come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and find none: cut it down; why cumbereth it the ground?" 13:7;

And he answering said unto him, "Lord, let it alone this year also, till I shall dig about it, and dung it: 13:8; "And if it bear fruit, well: and if not, then after that thou shalt cut it down." 13:9;

. . .

Woman, thou art loosed from thine infirmity. 13:12;

• • •

Thou hypocrite, doth not each one of you on the Sabbath loose his ox or his ass from the stall, and lead him away to watering? 13:15; And ought not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan hath bound, lo!, these eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the Sabbath day? 13:16;

. . .

Unto what is the kingdom of El like? and whereunto shall I resemble it? 13:18; It is like a grain of mustard seed, which a man took, and cast into his garden; and it grew, and waxed a great tree; and the fowls of the air lodged in the branches of it. 13:19;

Whereunto shall I liken the kingdom of El? 13:20; It is like leaven, which a woman took and hid in three measures of meal, till the whole was leavened. 13:21;

. . .

Strive to enter in at the strait gate: for many, I say unto you, will seek to enter in, and shall not be able. 13:24;

When once the master of the house is risen up, and hath shut to the door, and ye begin to stand without, and to knock at the door, saying, "Lord, Lord, open unto us"; and he shall answer and say unto you, "I know you not whence ye are": 13:25;

Then shall ye begin to say, "We have eaten and drunk in thy presence, and thou hast taught in our streets." 13:26; But he shall say, "I tell you, I know you not whence ye are: depart from me, all ye workers of iniquity." 13:27;

There shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth, when ye shall see Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, and all the prophets, in the kingdom of El, and you yourselves thrust out! 13:28;

And they shall come from the east, and from the west, and from the north, and from the south, and shall sit down in the kingdom of El. 13:29; And, behold, there are last which shall be first, and there are first which shall be last. 13:30; • • •

Go ye, and tell that fox, "Behold, I cast out devils, and I do cures to day and to morrow, and the third day I shall be perfected." 13:32; Nevertheless I must walk to day, and to morrow, and the day following: for it cannot be that a prophet perish out of Jerusalem. 13:33;

O' Jerusalem, Jerusalem, which killest the prophets, and stonest them that are sent unto thee; how often would I have gathered thy children together, as a hen doth gather her brood under her wings, and ye would not! 13:34; Behold, your house is left unto you desolate: and verily I say unto you, Ye shall not see me, until the time come when ye shall say, "Blessed is he that cometh in the name of Yahweh." 13:35;

# 14:3;

Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath day?

. . .

Which of you shall have an ass or an ox fallen into a pit, and will not straightway pull him out on the Sabbath day? 14:5;

. . .

When thou art bidden of any man to a wedding, sit not down in the highest room; lest a more honourable man than thou be bidden of him; 14:8; And he that bade thee and him come and say to thee, "Give this man place"; and thou begin with shame to take the lowest room. 14:9; But when thou art bidden, go and sit down in the lowest room; that when he that bade thee cometh, he may say unto thee, "Friend, go up higher": then shalt thou have worship (honor-ed.) in the presence of them that sit at meat with thee. 14:10;

For whosoever exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted. 14:11;

When thou makest a dinner or a supper, call not thy friends, nor thy brethren, neither thy kinsmen, nor thy rich neighbours;

lest they also bid thee again, and a recompence be made thee. 14:12; But when thou makest a feast, call the poor, the maimed, the lame, the blind: 14:13; And thou shalt be blessed; for they cannot recompense thee: for thou shalt be recompensed at the resurrection of the just. 14:14;

. . .

A certain man made a great supper, and bade many: 14:16; And sent his servant at supper time to say to them that were bidden, "Come; for all things are now ready." 14:17;

And they all with one consent began to make excuse. The first said unto him, "I have bought a piece of ground, I must needs go and see it: I pray thee have me excused." 14:18;

And another said, "I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I go to prove them: I pray thee have me excused." 14:19;

And another said, "I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come." 14:20;

So that servant came, and shewed his lord these things. Then the master of the house being angry said to his servant, "Go out quickly into the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in hither the poor, and the maimed, and the halt, and the blind." 14:21; And the servant said, "Lord, it is done as thou hast commanded, and yet there is room." 14:22; And the lord said unto the servant, "Go out into the highways and hedges, and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled. 14:23; "For I say unto you, That none of those men which were bidden, shall taste of my supper." 14:24;

. . .

If any man come to me, and hate not his father, and mother, and wife, and children, and brethren, and sisters, yea, and his own life also, he cannot be my disciple. 14:26; And whosoever doth not bear his cross, and come after me, cannot be my disciple. 14:27; For which of you, intending to build a tower, sitteth not down first and counteth the cost, whether he have sufficient to finish it? 14:28;

Lest haply, after he hath laid the foundation, and is not able to finish it, all that behold it begin to mock him, 14:29; Saying, "This man began to build, and was not able to finish!" 14:30;

Or what king, going to make war against another king, sitteth not down first, and consulteth whether he be able with ten thousand to meet him that cometh against him with twenty thousand? 14:31; Or else, while the other is yet a great way off, he sendeth an ambassage, and desireth conditions of peace. 14:32;

So likewise, whosoever he be of you that forsaketh not all that he hath, he cannot be my disciple. 14:33;

Salt is good: but if the salt have lost his savour, wherewith shall it be seasoned? 14:34; It is neither fit for the land, nor yet for the dunghill; but men cast it out.

He that hath ears to hear, let him hear! 14:35;

# 15:4;

What man of you, having an hundred sheep, if he lose one of them, doth not leave the ninety and nine in the wilderness, and go after that which is lost, until he find it? And when he hath found it, he layeth it on his shoulders, rejoicing. 15:5; And when he cometh home, he calleth together his friends and neighbours, saying unto them, "Rejoice with me; for I have found my sheep which was lost." 15:6; I say unto you, that likewise, joy shall be in heaven over one sinner that repenteth, more than over ninety and nine just persons which need no repentance. 15:7;

Either what woman having ten pieces of silver, if she lose one piece, doth not light a candle, and sweep the house, and seek diligently till she find it? 15:8; And when she hath found it, she calleth her friends and her neighbours together, saying, "Rejoice with me; for I have found the piece which I had lost." 15:9; Likewise, I say unto you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of El over one sinner that repenteth. 15:10;

A certain man had two sons: 15:11; And the younger of them

said to his father, "Father, give me the portion of goods that falleth to me." And he divided unto them his living. 15:12; And not many days after the younger son gathered all together, and took his journey into a far country, and there wasted his substance with riotous living. 15:13;

And when he had spent all, there arose a mighty famine in that land; and he began to be in want. 15:14; And he went and joined himself to a citizen of that country; and he sent him into his fields to feed swine. 15:15; And he would fain have filled his belly with the husks that the swine did eat: and no man gave unto him. 15:16; And when he came to himself, he said, "How many hired servants of my father's have bread enough and to spare, and I perish with hunger! 15:17; I will arise and go to my father, and will say unto him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven, and before thee, 15:18; 'And am no more worthy to be called thy son: make me as one of thy hired servants!" 15:19; And he arose, and came to his father. But when he was yet a great way off, his father saw him, and had compassion, and ran, and fell on his neck, and kissed him. 15:20; And the son said unto him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven, and in thy sight, and am no more worthy to be called thy son." 15:21:

But the father said to his servants, "Bring forth the best robe, and put it on him; and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet: 15:22; And bring hither the fatted calf, and kill it; and let us eat, and be merry: 15:23; For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found!" And they began to be merry. 15:24;

Now his elder son was in the field: and as he came and drew nigh to the house, he heard musick and dancing. 15:25; And he called one of the servants, and asked what these things meant. 15:26; And he said unto him, "Thy brother is come; and thy father hath killed the fatted calf, because he hath received him safe and sound." 15:27; And he was angry, and would not go in: therefore

came his father out, and intreated him. 15:28; And he, answering, said to his father, "Lo, these many years do I serve thee, neither transgressed I at any time thy commandment: and yet thou never gavest me a kid, that I might make merry with my friends: 15:29; But as soon as this thy son was come which hath devoured thy living with harlots, thou hast killed for him the fatted calf!" 15:30;

And he said unto him, "Son, thou art ever with me, and all that I have is thine. 15:31; It was meet that we should make merry, and be glad: for this thy brother was dead, and is alive again; and was lost, and is found!" 15:32;

### 16:1;

There was a certain rich man, which had a steward; and the same was accused unto him, that he had wasted his goods. And he called him, and said unto him, "How is it that I hear this of thee? give an account of thy stewardship; for thou mayest be no longer steward." 16:2;

Then the steward said within himself, "What shall I do? for my lord taketh away from me the stewardship: I cannot dig; to beg, I am ashamed. 16:3; I am resolved what to do, that, when I am put out of the stewardship, they may receive me into their houses." 16:4; So he called every one of his lord's debtors unto him, and said unto the first, "How much owest thou unto my lord?" 16:5; And he said, "An hundred measures of oil." And he said unto him, "Take thy bill, and sit down quickly, and write fifty." 16:6; Then said he to another, "And how much owest thou?" And he said, "An hundred measures of wheat." And he said unto him, "Take thy bill, and write fourscore." 16:7; And the lord commended the unjust steward, because he had done wisely: for the children of this world are in their generation wiser than the children of Light. 16:8;

And I say unto you, Make to yourselves friends of the mammon of unrighteousness; that, when ye fail, they may receive you into everlasting habitations. 16:9; He that is faithful in that which is least, is faithful also in much: and he that is unjust in the least, is unjust also in much. 16:10; If therefore ye have not been faithful in the unrighteous mammon, who will commit to your trust the true riches? 16:11; And if ye have not been faithful in that which is another man's, who shall give you that which is your own? 16:12; No servant can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve El and mammon. 16:13;

. . .

Ye are they which justify yourselves before men; but El knoweth your hearts: for that which is highly esteemed among men is abomination in the sight of El. 16:15; The Law and the Prophets were until John: since that time the kingdom of El is preached, and every man presseth into it. 16:16; And it is easier for heaven and earth to pass, than one tittle of the Law to fail. 16:17;

Whosoever putteth away his wife, and marrieth another, committeth adultery: and whosoever marrieth her that is put away from her husband committeth adultery. 16:18;

. .

There was a certain rich man, which was clothed in purple and fine linen, and fared sumptuously every day: 16:19; And there was a certain beggar named Lazarus, which was laid at his gate, full of sores, 16:20; And desiring to be fed with the crumbs which fell from the rich man's table: moreover the dogs came and licked his sores. 16:21; And it came to pass, that the beggar died, and was carried by the angels into Abraham's bosom: the rich man also died, and was buried; 16:22; And in hell (sheel-ed.) he lift up his eyes, being in torments, and seeth Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom. 16:23; And he cried and said, "Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus, that he may dip the tip of his finger in water, and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame!" 16:24; But Abraham said, "Son, remember that thou in thy

lifetime receivedst thy good things, and likewise Lazarus evil things: but now he is comforted and thou art tormented. 16:25;

"And beside all this, between us and you there is a great gulf fixed: so that they which would pass from hence to you cannot; neither can they pass to us, that would come from thence." 16:26;

Then he said, "I pray thee therefore, father, that thou wouldest send him to my father's house: 16:27; For I have five brethren; that he may testify unto them, lest they also come into this place of torment." 16:28;

Abraham saith unto him, "They have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them." 16:29;

And he said, "Nay, father Abraham: but if one went unto them from the dead, they will repent." 16:30;

And he said unto him, "If they hear not Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded, though one rose from the dead." 16:31;

#### *17:1;*

It is impossible but that offences will come: but woe unto him, through whom they come! It were better for him that a millstone were hanged about his neck, and he cast into the sea, than that he should offend one of these little ones. 17:2;

Take heed to yourselves: if thy brother trespass against thee, rebuke him; and if he repent, forgive him. 17:3; And if he trespass against thee seven times in a day, and seven times in a day turn again to thee, saying, "I repent!"; thou shalt forgive him. 17:4;

...

If ye had faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye might say unto this sycamine tree, "Be thou plucked up by the root, and be thou planted in the sea"; and it should obey you. 17:6; But which of you, having a servant plowing or feeding cattle, will say unto him by and by, when he is come from the field, "Go and sit down to meat?" 17:7; And will not rather say unto him, "Make ready wherewith I may sup, and gird thyself, and serve me, till I have eaten and drunken; and afterward thou shalt eat and drink?" 17:8; Doth he thank that servant because he did the things that were commanded him? I trow not. 17:9;

So likewise ye, when ye shall have done all those things which are commanded you, say, "We are unprofitable servants: we have done that which was our duty to do." 17:10;

...

Go shew yourselves unto the priests. 17:14;

• • •

Were there not ten cleansed? but where are the nine? 17:17; There are not found that returned to give glory to El, save this stranger. 17:18;

Arise, go thy way: thy faith hath made thee whole. 17:19;

The kingdom of El cometh not with observation: 17:20; Neither shall they say, "Lo here!" or, "lo there!" for, behold, the kingdom of El is within you. 17:21;

The days will come when ye shall desire to see one of the days of the Son of man, and ye shall not see it. 17:22; And they shall say to you, "See here!"; or, "see there!": go not after them, nor follow them. 17:23; For as the lightning that lighteneth out of the one part under heaven, shineth unto the other part under heaven; so shall also the Son of Man be in his day. 17:24; But first must he suffer many things, and be rejected of this generation. 17:25; And as it was in the days of Noe, so shall it be also in the days of the Son of man. 17:26; They did eat, they drank, they married wives, they were given in marriage, until the day that Noe entered into the ark, and the flood came, and destroyed them all. 17:27;

Likewise also as it was in the days of Lot; they did eat, they drank, they bought, they sold, they planted, they builded; 17:28;

But the same day that Lot went out of Sodom, it rained fire and brimstone from heaven, and destroyed them all. 17:29; Even thus shall it be in the day when the Son of man is revealed! 17:30; In that day, he which shall be upon the housetop, and his stuff in the house, let him not come down to take it away: and he that is in the field, let him likewise not return back! 17:31; Remember Lot's wife. 17:32;

Whosoever shall seek to save his life shall lose it; and whosoever shall lose his life shall preserve it. 17:33; I tell you, in that night there shall be two men in one bed; the one shall be taken, and the other shall be left. 17:34; Two women shall be grinding together: the one shall be taken, and the other left. 17:35; Two men shall be in the field: the one shall be taken, and the other left. 17:36;

Wheresoever the body is, thither will the eagles be gathered together. 17:37;

### *18:2;*

There was in a city a judge which feared not El, neither regarded man:

And there was a widow in that city; and she came unto him, saying, "Avenge me of mine adversary." 18:3; And he would not, for a while: but afterward he said within himself, "Though I fear not El, nor regard man; 18:4; Yet because this widow troubleth me, I will avenge her, lest by her continual coming, she weary me. 18:5;

Hear what the unjust judge saith. 18:6;

And shall not El avenge his own elect, which cry day and night unto him, though he bear long with them? 18:7; I tell you that he will avenge them speedily. Nevertheless when the Son of man cometh, shall he find faith on the earth? 18:8;

Two men went up into the Temple to pray; the one a Pharisee, and the other a publican. 18:10; The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, "El, I thank thee, that I am not as other men are,

extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican. 18:11; I fast twice in the week, I give tithes of all that I possess." 18:12;

And the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, "El, be merciful to me, a sinner!" 18:13; I tell you, this man went down to his house justified, rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted. 18:14:

...

Suffer little children to come unto me, and forbid them not: for of such is the kingdom of El. 18:16; Verily I say unto you, Whosoever shall not receive the kingdom of El as a little child, shall in no wise enter therein. 18:17:

. . .

Why callest thou me good? none is good, save one, that is, El. 18:19; Thou knowest the Commandments, "Do not commit adultery, Do not kill, Do not steal, Do not bear false witness, Honour thy father and thy mother." 18:20;

. . .

Yet lackest thou one thing: sell all that thou hast, and distribute unto the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, follow me. 18:22;

...

How hardly shall they that have riches, enter into the kingdom of El! 18:24;

18:25; For it is easier for a rope ('camel'\*) to go through a needle's eye, than for a rich man to enter into the kingdom of El. (\*camel = rope: page 1041, Lamsa's Aramaic Peshitta-ed.)

. .

The things which are impossible with men are possible with El. 18:27;

. . .

Verily I say unto you, There is no man that hath left house, or parents, or brethren, or wife, or children, for the Kingdom of El's sake, 18:29; Who shall not receive manifold more in this present time, and in the world to come Life everlasting. 18:30;

Behold, we go up to Jerusalem, and all things that are written by the prophets concerning the Son of man shall be accomplished. 18:31; For he shall be delivered unto the Gentiles, and shall be mocked, and spitefully entreated, and spitted on: 18:32; And they shall scourge him, and put him to death: and the third day he shall rise again. 18:33;

. . .

What wilt thou that I shall do unto thee? 18:41; Receive thy sight, thy faith hath saved thee. 18:42;

### 19:5;

Zacchaeus, make haste, and come down; for to day I must abide at thy house!

. . .

This day is salvation come to this house, forsomuch as he also is a son of Abraham. 19:9; For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost. 19:10:

. . .

A certain nobleman went into a far country to receive for himself a kingdom, and to return. 19:12; And he called his ten servants and delivered them ten pounds, and said unto them, "Occupy, till I come." 19:13;

But his citizens hated him, and sent a message after him, saying, "We will not have this man to reign over us." 19:14;

And it came to pass, that when he was returned, having received the kingdom, then he commanded these servants to be called unto him, to whom he had given the money, that he might

know how much every man had gained by trading. 19:15;

(... and they said unto him, Lord, he hath ten pounds!) 19:25; For I say unto you, That unto every one which hath, shall be given; and from him that hath not, even that he hath shall be taken away from him. 19:26;

"But those mine enemies, which would not that I should reign over them, bring hither, and slay them before me!" 19:27;

...

Go ye into the village over against you; in the which at your entering ye shall find a colt tied, whereon yet never man sat: loose him, and bring him hither. 19:30; And if any man ask you, "Why do ye loose him?" thus shall ye say unto him, "Because the Lord (Master) hath need of him." 19:31;

. . .

I tell you that, if these should hold their peace, the stones would immediately cry out. 19:40;

. . .

If thou hadst known, even thou, at least in this thy day, the things which belong unto thy peace! but now they are hid from thine eyes. 19:42; For the days shall come upon thee, that thine enemies shall cast a trench about thee, and compass thee round, and keep thee in on every side, 19:43; And shall lay thee even with the ground, and thy children within thee; and they shall not leave in thee one stone upon another; because thou knewest not the time of thy visitation. 19:44;

. . .

It is written, "My house is the house of prayer": but ye have made it a den of thieves!" 19:46;

#### 20:3;

I will also ask you one thing; and answer me: The baptism of John, was it from heaven, or of men? 20:4;

. . .

Neither tell I you, by what authority I do these things. 20:8;

A certain man planted a vineyard, and let it forth to husbandmen, and went into a far country for a long time. 20:9; And at the season he sent a servant to the husbandmen, that they should give him of the fruit of the vineyard: but the husbandmen beat him, and sent him away empty. 20:10; And again he sent another servant: and they beat him also, and entreated him shamefully, and sent him away empty. 20:11; And again he sent a third: and they wounded him also, and cast him out. 20:12;

Then said the lord of the vineyard, "What shall I do? The children of this world marry, and are given in marriage; 20:34; But they which shall be accounted worthy to obtain that world, and the Resurrection from the dead, neither marry, nor are given in marriage; 20:35; Neither can they die any more, for they are equal unto the angels; and are the children of El, being the children of the Resurrection. 20:36;
